Rules and Regulations for National-Level Competition 2024-25

1. Eligibility Criteria

- 1.1 Only registered students of SWI for the academic year 2024-25 are eligible to participate.
- 1.2 Students must meet all eligibility criteria as outlined in SWI's National Championship guidelines.
- 1.3 Eligible participants include those selected through school, and district, meeting the required scores.
- 1.4 The national participation option will be visible in the student's dashboard for eligible candidates.

2. Profile and Registration

- 2.1 Participants must update their profiles with:
 - Recent photograph.
 - Birth certificate.
 - Accurate postal address, email ID, and contact numbers.
 - T-shirt size.
- 2.2 Failure to complete the profile will result in disqualification, with no rescheduling or refunds.

3. Examination Format

- 3.1 The competition will use a USA-based proctoring system to ensure integrity.
- 3.2 Participants must enable their camera, microphone, and screen-sharing during the exam.
- 3.3 Student's ID card must be displayed on camera before starting the exam.
- 3.4 Students must wear an ID card with a long ribbon, which should be shown to the camera for identity confirmation before the exam starts.
- 3.5 Trial Oral Round exams can be attended from the student's respective home or school.

4. Technical and Infrastructure Requirements

- 4.1 Participants must have a stable internet connection and a functioning webcam, microphone, and device capable of screen sharing.
- 4.2 Schools and students are responsible for arranging a distraction-free environment during the exam.
- 4.3 SWI will provide technical support during trial exams but not on the competition day.

5. Exam Rules and Procedures

- 5.1 Participants are allowed one attempt per exam.
- 5.2 Closing the exam without completing may not fetch marks for not attempted questions.



- 5.3 Rescheduling is not permitted. Absenteeism will be treated as a withdrawal, and no certificates or titles will be issued.
- 5.4 Trial examinations and tutorials will be available to familiarize participants with the competition platform.
- 5.5 The time limit for both the Trial Exam and the final National Championship is 1 hour (60 minutes).
- 5.6 A negative marking system will be applied if a student exceeds the prescribed time limit. For every additional two minutes taken, one mark will be deducted from the total score.

6. Competition Rounds

- 6.1 The competition includes multiple rounds specific to student groups and grades: as outlined in the prospectus.
- 6.2 Types of rounds as per the group/category will be as mentioned in the prospectus.

7. Wild Card Entries

- 7.1 Schools can nominate wild card entries for students who missed previous competitions due to genuine reasons.
- 7.2 Wild card entries will incur an additional fee of ₹2500, inclusive of preparatory material and competition fees.

8. Scoring and Prizes

- 8.1 A minimum score of 40% is required to qualify for prizes or titles.
- 8.2 The top 10 performers in each group will receive certificates, with the top positions awarded trophies and cash prizes.
- 8.3 Cash Prize details will be as mentioned in the prospectus.
- 8.4 In case of a tie between multiple students, we'll conduct an additional tiebreaker round between those with the same score.

9. Code of Conduct

- 9.1 Participants must adhere to SWI's rules and instructions during the competition.
- 9.2 Any form of malpractice or rule violation will lead to immediate disqualification.

10. Promotional Activities

10.1 Participants must attend promotional activities as required, including media interviews and award ceremonies.

11. Disputes and Final Decisions

- 11.1 The Competition Committee's decisions are final and binding.
- 11.2 SWI reserves the right to modify rules without prior notice. Participants must check the SWI platform for updates regularly.



12. Payment and Cancellation Policy

- 12.1 Online Submissions: All entries must be submitted through the dedicated online portal at www.competition.spellwellindia.com, accessible via the student login. Each eligible student has been assigned a specific Username and Password for logging in to the Online Entry System. Individual entries sent via mail or any other form of communication will not be accepted.
- 12.2 It is imperative that all entries receive approval before the deadline. However, schools are allowed to submit entries via email or another prescribed mode of communication.
- 12.3 Cancellations are allowed until 12:00 noon, 20th January 2025. After this deadline, no changes will be accepted, and penalty policies will apply.
 - 12.4 Transfer of participants from one State to another is allowed only before the start of the season. Once registered with a particular State, the participants will not be given any transfer during the academic year.

13. Award Ceremony and Additional Oral Round

- 13.1 Spell Well India may organize an award ceremony to honor national top-performing students. This event will be exclusive to students selected for awards.
- 13.2 Prizes such as cash awards, trophies, and certificates for national winners will be distributed during this event.
- 13.3 The organizing committee may decide to conduct a second oral round of examination during the ceremony. In this round, students will have the opportunity to elevate their ranking and title by providing correct answers to five unique spellings asked during an inperson oral examination.
- 13.4 The second oral round and the award ceremony may be conducted in Delhi, provided the number of participants from across India meets the prescribed limit set by the organizing committee.
- 13.5 If the desired number of participants is not met at the national level, the award ceremony and the second oral round will not take place. Instead, trophies, certificates, and cash prizes will be sent to the respective schools, which will then distribute them to the winners during a school assembly or a special function organized for national winners.

14. Results Announcement for SWI's National Championship:

- 14.1 The results for the SWI National Championship will be declared on 25th March 2025, highlighting the top-performing students eligible for the 2nd oral round at the Delhi NCR Award Ceremony venue.
- 14.2 If the Award Ceremony does not take place as per the terms set for the Nationals, the results declared on 25th March 2025 will remain final, and students will receive their trophies and certificates through their respective schools. However, if the 2nd oral round occurs in Delhi NCR, the additional scores will be factored in, and the final title holders will be announced during the ceremony.
